## Why should you be concerned about dealing with hazardous waste?

The introduction of the new Special Waste Amendment (Scotland) Regulations 2004, and the requirements of the Landfill (Scotland) Regulations 2003, mean that businesses are facing increased waste management costs, and many are now finding themselves having to deal with the complexities of hazardous waste for the first time.

However there are ways of minimising the impact of hazardous waste on your business, by preventing or reducing the amount produced in the first place. It is even possible that your hazardous "waste" could be used as a resource by someone else. These options will save you money and reduce the impact on the environment.

**You are invited to attend a FREE half-day workshop on hazardous waste. This event will focus on the regulatory controls put in place to deal with hazardous waste, practical measures available to minimise waste and techniques to help manage resources better. At the end of the event, delegates will be able to:**

- Understand the legal implications in dealing with hazardous waste
- Be familiar with techniques to reduce hazardous waste and save money
- Introduce the concept of resource-sharing between companies
- Be familiar with training and business support available to companies to deal with hazardous waste

## Who is this event aimed at?

This event will be of particular interest to waste producers, especially those whose wastes are newly designated as 'hazardous'. For example, fluorescent lighting tubes, bulbs, oily wastes, pesticides and electrical equipment. Business support organisations and trade associations will also be interested in the seminar.

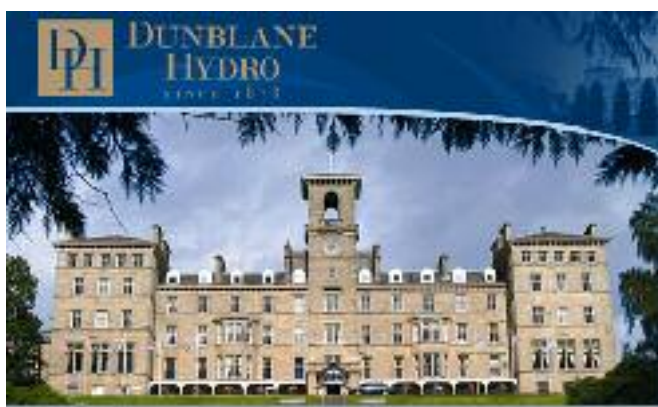

## By Road

### From Edinburgh:

Take M8 to Newbridge interchange, follow sign posts for M9 (Stirling) and continue along M9. Take exit for Dunblane and drive for half a mile on the dual carriage-way then go straight over the roundabout. The hotel is 200 yards on the right.

### From Glasgow:

Follow the signs for Stirling M80. Keep on the M80 and it will go onto the A80 for a few miles and then revert back to the motorway. Do not take exit for Stirling, but keep on until you see the sign for Dunblane. At roundabout, take the exit for Dunblane and continue on the dual carriage-way for about half a mile until you come to a roundabout. Go straight over and about 200 yards on the right hand side.

### From Inverness:

Take the A9 south, bypassing Pitlochry and Dunkeld, and at Perth Inveralmond and Broxden roundabouts follow the signs for Stirling. Continue south for around 25 miles and you will come to a large roundabout with an exit clearly signposted for Dunblane. At the roundabout, take the exit for Dunblane and continue on the dual carriage-way for about half a mile until you come to a roundabout. Go straight over and about 200 yards on the right hand side, you will see the sign-posted entrance to the hotel.

### From Aberdeen and Dundee:

Take the A90 all the way to Perth, to join the A9 southbound. At the Broxden roundabout at the southern end of Perth follow the signs for Stirling and proceed as for Inverness above.

## By Rail

The hotel is about a 10-minute walk from the main Dunblane railway station. **Please note that not all north and south-bound rail services stop at Dunblane, so please check the service you are on before you make arrangements.** Taxis are available at Dunblane Station. Local taxi numbers are: 01786 821010, or 01786 824888.
